**Activity Level - MODERATE**

**Wednesday:** Transfer to the airport for our flight to Boston. Upon arrival we will meet our tour escort and drive south, stopping in Plymouth, where the Pilgrims established their first settlement in the New World and had their first Thanksgiving. We then continue on to Cape Cod, where we have accommodations for the next three evenings. You are treated to a delicious welcome dinner this evening. (Dinner)

**Thursday:** Our full day tour of Cape Cod begins at its easternmost point, Provincetown, where we will see the sight of the Pilgrim's first landing and enjoy the town's quaint shops and houses. We will see images of Cape Cod's weathered shingled cottages, seagrass-sprayed dunes, historic architecture and old New England Inns as we travel along Olde King's Highway. Also included are visits to Hyannis and Yarmouth as well as the National Seashore Park, with its famous Highland Light. Enjoy the delicious "lobsterfest" that is planned for us this evening. (Breakfast, Dinner)

**Friday:** After driving to Woods Hole, we board a ferry for the cruise to Martha's Vineyard. A delightful tour of this island, which was made famous by the Kennedy "clan" in the 60s, is on our agenda today. You will enjoy the Gingerbread Houses, Island Tabernacle and Antique Carousel of Oak Bluffs, and learn about the history of some of the island's well known residents. The terrain is uniquely stark and the towns are small, quaint and quite interesting, evoking visions of an era long gone. Time is provided to explore the town of Edgartown with its many shops, eateries, attractions and extraordinary views of the Atlantic Ocean. Late afternoon has us cruising back to the Cape. (Breakfast, Dinner)

**Saturday:** Today we depart Cape Cod and drive to Newport, Rhode Island to explore the city's historic riches and gain an understanding of why it has become such a popular vacation retreat. We'll see the famous Newport Waterfront, elegant churches, Fort Adams State Park, Newport Colony House, Trinity Church - the nation's first church steeple, and, of course, the many Gilded Age mansions along Bellevue Avenue. On our tour of one of these fabulous mansions, you will capture a glimpse of the incredible lifestyle led by America's "Rich & Famous" in the early 20<sup>th</sup> century. We also take the famous scenic 11 mile Ocean Drive, passing Newport's numerous yachts, sailing ships and opulent homes as well as being afforded panoramic views of the Atlantic Ocean, Newport Harbor, the city and Jamestown Bridge. After enjoying dinner, we travel to Boston and check into our centrally located hotel where we have accommodations for the next 3 evenings. (Breakfast, Dinner)

**Sunday:** Tour historic Boston as we travel the "Freedom Trail" to see, among other things, Faneuil Hall, the Old North Church - immortalized by Longfellow's "Midnight Ride of Paul Revere," the U.S.S. Constitution, Boston Common, the site of the Boston Massacre, Beacon Hill, the Old State House, the Old Corner Bookstore and the Bunker Hill Monument. We will be provided with time to enjoy the sites and sounds of the famous Quincy Market. A visit to the John F. Kennedy Presidential Library & Museum is planned, where we learn about the Kennedy clan as well as JFK's early years, presidency and legacy. (Breakfast)

**Monday:** Our tour of Boston continues with a visit to Harvard Square in the center of Cambridge, and the home of Harvard University - the oldest institution of higher education in the United States. Included is a guided tour of Fenway Park (subject to availability) before taking the short drive to two of America's most historic towns - Concord and Lexington. It was here in the rural countryside that the first shots of the American Revolution were fired in 1775. Some of the places we will see include Lexington Green, the Minuteman National Park, the North Bridge, home of Louisa May Alcott and Monument Square just to name a few. Another interesting fact: it was in Concord that the ubiquitous Concord Grape was developed. A bit of free time is provided to explore Boston at your leisure. (Breakfast, Dinner)



**Tuesday:** After checking out of our hotel, we'll drive to Salem, known as the location of the infamous "Witch Trials" of the 1690s. You'll see the site of the Witch Trials, the Custom House and Nathaniel Hawthorne's "House of the Seven Gables" before returning to Logan Airport for our flight home. (Breakfast)
